Restoring history

Crumbling monument receives some TLC

BEDFORD — A well-known monument at Green Hill Cemetery is getting a makeover.

Thursday, Kopelov Cut Stone added a limestone lid to the Paolini Temple monument, which is modeled after the Greek Parthenon.

Pam Henderson, board member for the Green Hill Cemetery, said the business created new columns and a lid for the monument. The structure was crumbling under its own weight.

The cost to fix the monument is about \$10,000. Henderson said the family hasn't displayed interest in the monument's upkeep.

"The family is distant now," she said.

The cemetery received a Lawrence County Community Foundation challenge grant to help. The cemetery needs to raise \$7,000 in order to receive up to \$3,500 of grant money. The Paolini monument's restoration would be paid for with the donations.

Stan Ritchison, cemetery board member, said the cemetery is about halfway to its goal. He said the cemetery also received a \$1,000 grant from Lawrence County Tourism.

"This is hopefully an ongoing project where we can take ... one-of-akind things in desperate need of help," Ritchison said.

Henderson said fixing up markers like the Paolini Temple can only add to the beauty of the cemetery.

"What we are hoping to do is ... get a restoration-type organization together so we can have ongoing contributions ... to actively restore these things," Henderson said.
